KS Farm Bureau and KFAC to Hold Ag in the Classroom Training Workshops

MANHATTAN, Kan. – The Kansas Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom (KFAC) and Kansas Farm Bureau (KFB) will host several Ag in the Classroom educator training workshops this January and February throughout the state.

The workshops, which are designed especially for agriculture education presenters at the county level, will give participants the opportunity to receive training for a variety of ag-based hands-on learning labs, receive resource materials, share ideas, network with others and practice presentation skills.

Some of the people who may be interested in attending a workshop include Cooperative Extension educators, county Farm Bureau agriculture education volunteers, Kansas Conservation District managers, agricultural educators and other youth presenters.

The dates and locations for the one-day workshops are Jan. 19 in Manhattan, Jan. 26 in Emporia, Feb. 2 in Colby and Feb. 9 in Garden City. Specific meeting rooms will be announced closer to the date of each workshop. There must be a minimum of 10 participants at each location in order to conduct a workshop. In the event that one of the workshops will not be held, participants who have signed up to attend it may attend any of the other workshops instead.

Registration fees are \$35 per person and include lunch, refreshments and resource materials. Registration forms and fees are due by Jan. 4 to the KFB Accounting and Human Resources department in Manhattan.
