The navigation is now a horizontal menu, which has each section that drops down into sub-sections. The four sections are Teachers, Students, About Us and Join Us. Also incorporated into the navigation menu are KFAC's social media buttons, allowing viewers to find out more about the Foundation and keep up-to-date with KFAC news and the 30th Anniversary campaign running through the rest of the year.

KFAC's commitment to Kansas teachers is shown in the "Teachers" section, where lesson plans and resources are available. Not only can teachers look for lesson plans by commodity, they can search by subject matter - such as math or science, or by grade level.
